U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP)—Steel demand continues strong, though the fourth quarter may see some changes in consumer pressure, Steel, the metalworking weekly, said Sunday.

Orders already placed for the third quarter indicate "a period of high steel operations, unless unexpected cancellations develop," the magazine stated. It added: "Early this year there were predictions that steel demand would decline sufficiently to cut steel production in the third quarter. As the year progressed, the date of decline was moved to the fourth quarter. Now, everyone wants to know what really is in store for the last quarter."

Steel said order cancellations received thus far do not indicate any pattern. Some cancellations, the magazine stated, "may stem from changes in the defence program and the change in steel price structure."

Other cancellations may indicate that "some steel users have attempted to revise their specifications to avoid some of the price increases." Steel said.

But some observers, the weekly declared, foresee the present strong demand for steel continuing through the fourth quarter.

avoid riots and disturbances like those in East Germany and Czechoslovakia by improving worker morale and particularly the morale of millions of dispossessed peasants and farmers.

Diplomats in ... regarded it as particularly significant that Rakosi has been succeeded by Imre Nagy, a former agricultural minister who promised to slow the rural collectivization and industrialization which have brought chaos to a land that once was Central Europe's bread basket.

Diplomatic observers said there were no grounds for speculation that Rakosi was removed as premier because of his Jewish background.

In fact, the dismissal Friday of Istvan Kovacs as vice-president of the presidium eliminated from power the leader of the anti-semitic group within the Hungarian hierarchy.

Diplomats here said the removal of Stalin's hatchet ... from the premiership, which he had held 11 months, is in line with the Soviet policy of drawing a line between the Communist party and the state.

Rakosi, as No. 1 in the new nine-man party politburo, probably will conserve much of his power and influence over the future of Hungary.

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market kept rolling ahead in its recovery movement last week despite several severe handicaps.

The market hit bottom for the year nearly a month ago. For the last three weeks the trend has been higher. This has encouraged many to hope that July and August will conform to the historic pattern and result in an upward movement. The daily average of trading last week came to only 877,000 shares, lowest since the third week in May of 1949.

Traders were reluctant to take a position and the public as well seemed to show no enthusiasm for trading.
