Pair Plead Guilty To Gasoline Theft

Charged with stealing approximately three gallons of gasoline from John William Perry, and one gallon of gasoline from James McKenna, S. Shippers Threatened Against Spud Dealers

Failure to secure a potato export license, or to report on export levies collected, and failing to remit levies may result in a number of potato growers and dealers facing court action, Agriculture Minister Andrew B. MacLeod said yesterday.

Under the regulation covering shipping of potatoes from the province, a levy of one cent per 100 pounds of potatoes from the marketing is required, with the money going to the P. E. I. Potato Marketing Board for industry purposes.

Mr. MacLeod said that at least 34 growers and dealers are involved. He said 17 persons shipped without a license and did not report on levies collected. 15 have an export license but didn't report on the amounts collected or remit the levy for the

board, and five who have an export license reported on the levies collected but did not remit the money to the proper source.

According to Mr. MacLeod, the dealers and growers are being notified by a lawyer that they have until March 9 to comply with potato export regulations or face legal action.

About a year ago there was a court ruling that the potato marketing board did not have power to collect the one cent levy, but since that time new legislation was passed giving the board its collection power.

"The law is stronger now," said Mr. MacLeod, "and we have been advised by legal authorities of the federal department of agriculture that it's O.K."
