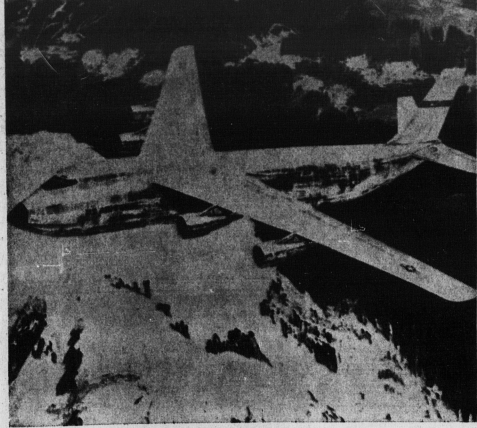

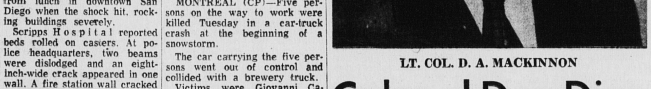
California Hit By Strong Quake
