Expansion Easing Expected In Canada's Gas Industry

The spectacular advances of the Canadian natural gas industry in the last decade now are expected to be replaced by a more gradual growth, says the Bank of Nova Scotia.

But, adds the bank, the rate of increase in the domestic market alone is likely to be substantial, supported by continuing expansion in non-petroleum industrial activity and by some further displacement of other forms of energy.

The bank, in its monthly report, says the exceptional performance of the natural gas industry in Canada is rapidly being fulfilled.

"In scarcely more than half a decade, production from the

gains the significance of the recent upturn in natural gas discoveries in the U.S.

"Furthermore, much depends on the attitude of U.S. regulatory authorities, and on the working out of the complicated pattern of proposed and projected transmission facilities and the various contractual supply relationships."

The bank says the domestic market, however, has been, and remains the largest factor in demand with sales to Canadian consumers last year estimated at around 1,200,000 cubic feet.

Natural gas now accounts for 19 per cent of all energy supplied in Canada today as compared with only five per cent of a much smaller total in the mid-1950s.

"Over the long-term," says the bank, "there can be little doubt that gas will continue to grow prospects for Canadian natural gas. The domestic market is expected to triple before 1980."

Favorable export prospects are suggested by estimates that at least 25 billion cubic feet of new gas reserves will be required each year in the U.S. to maintain a 20-year supply.

The bank adds that Canadian reserves, which were conservatively estimated at 35.5 billion cubic feet at the end of 1961 are forecast to grow to a net rate of two million million cubic feet a year in the next decade.

"There is every reason to expect that reserves will prove adequate to meet the growth in demand for many years ahead."

CONTRACT BRIDGE

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been:

1. 4 ♠ 2 ♠ South
 2. 4 ♠ 1 ♠ North
 3. 4 ♠ 2 ♠ South
 4. 4 ♠ 2 ♠ North

What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠ Q533 ♥ AK764 ♦ 72 ♣ 450
 2. ♠ A73 ♥ AK765 ♦ AK84
 3. ♠ A772 ♥ KQ322 ♦ 96 ♣ A3
 4. ♠ A8852 ♥ 7 ♦ AK5843 ♣ 5

The spades, before discussing the four hands, it might be best to first refer to the significance of North's bid. Generally, an overcall in the one level indicates a fairly good suit of at least five cards. North's bid of one spade over an overcall and other values that would not justify an opening bid as dealer, is merely a competitive bid directed chiefly towards achieving a part score.

The partner of the overcaller reacts accordingly. He bids naturally, but keeps in mind that the overall is not 11.8 equivalent of an opening bid, but is based on as little as 8 or 10 high-card points. In this hand, the proper action is to bid wrong to bid two hearts.

2. Three trump. It is highly likely, in view of North's spade bid, that game can be made, and the surest way of getting there is to take the direct route. Whatever the nature of North's spade bid, our hand figures to produce game opposite it. North must have bid largely on distributional values, in which case he has a trump to spare. If he has a trump to spare, he will probably be in a jump to four spades, but if he accepts three trumps as the best contract, it will probably be a 3-2.

3. Four spades. It is obvious that the type of hand North has for his overcall, it is regardless of game must be undertaken. It is hard to imagine a hand North might have where he would be likely to lose four tricks. A mere invitation to game should not be issued with hands of this magnitude. You have to bid "right" in.

4. Four trump. Despite West's opening bid, there is a distinct possibility of North having a slam. The question of how many high-card points North has is not important, but whether he has an ace is. The way to find out is to use Blackwood.

If North responds five diamonds, showing one ace, the plan is to bid six spades. North's hand may be as poor as S-K-A-7-3. If North bids four hearts, even this sad collection would probably produce twelve tricks.
