The centennial of the opening and dedication of the present Trinity United Church, Charlottetown, will be observed this weekend. The congregation was organized in 1899 and the first Sunday school of any denomination was established in 1817.
 The present church was erected in 1883 and dedicated in 1884. It became known as the Brick Church, which was united in 1918 with Grace Church.
