New Pastoral Charge Of United Church In P.E.I.

A very impressive ceremony was held at Trinity United Church in Charlottetown, on Sunday, to establish the Parkdale - Central Royalty - East Royalty as a Pastoral charge of the United Church of Canada.

The service, presided over by Rev. T.R. Goudge, of Pownal, was opened in prayer by Rev. A. F. MacLean of Trinity United Church. Rev. Arthur Betts, of Winsloe, read an exhortation to steadfastness in the faith, from Hebrews 11 and 12, and this theme was further developed by Rev. J. M. Fraser, of Montague, in his sermon "Our Goodly Heritage," as he spoke of the works of our forefathers in the faith.

The Charter Roll for the new church was signed by 180 men and women, who pledged themselves during the Service of Constitution, to accept the responsibility of the new charge, and the Adherents Roll listed 51 persons who are not now members but who plan to unite on Profession of Faith.

Rev. T.A. Wilson, retired Minister of the United Church, now resident in East Royalty, led the Prayer of Dedication, and Rev. J.M. Sproule, of York, pronounced the benediction.

Ladies Auxiliary Met in Montague

The Ladies Auxiliary Branch No. 13 B.E.S.L., North Rustico, held their monthly meeting in Legion Hall, May 15. The president called the meeting to order and the usual silence was observed.

The minutes of last meeting were read by the secretary and approved as read. The treasurer's report was also approved as read. Twenty-six members were present, five of the Executive were present.

The Ways and Means Convenor brought in her report. A dance had been held in the Hall on Easter Monday night. A goodly sum was realized. New Business. All bills were voted paid. New material to be bought for drapes for doors and windows. Minute Book and Stationery and stamps to be bought for secretary.

Queen's County Magistrate's Court

Four persons, each charged with driving without an operator's license, appeared before Magistrate Gaudet on Friday afternoon, three of them, being residents of Vernon River, West Royalty, and Summerside, each being fined \$5.00 and costs, and the fourth, a City resident, receiving a reprimand. The resident of West Royalty was also fined \$5.00 and costs for non-registration of a motor vehicle in the current year, and the Summerside resident received an additional fine of \$10.00 and costs for speeding in a built-up area. Also under the Highway Traffic Act, a second resident of West Royalty was reprimanded for permitting an unlicensed person to drive a motor vehicle.

Under the Temperance Act, a City resident was fined \$20 and costs or 30 days for possession of liquor while not being a permit holder. A second City resident, charged with illegal possession of two gallons of illicit spirits had the charge dismissed after all the evidence was heard.

A resident of New London pleaded guilty to a charge of interfering with the lawful enjoyment of property by disturbing the peace of the occupants (drunk and disorderly) and was given a two-year suspended sentence, after having been bound-over to keep the peace.

Of two residents of Bay Fortune, charged with mischief occasioning damage to private property (a gasoline pump and light pole at Parkdale), one, the driver of the auto, was convicted and fined \$200 and costs or 90 days, the charge against the other being dismissed.

A resident of Saint John, N.B. was found guilty of false pretences and remanded to Monday morning, May 27th, for sentence. In the case of a City resident, charged with driving while intoxicated, the evidence of the Crown was complete, and the accused further remanded one week, to May 31st.
