

## New Brunswick, Nova Scotia Have Brush Fires Outbreak

Brush fires broke out in a number of areas in the Maritime Wednesday as temperatures soared into the 80s.

Fire broke out at Harrieville, N.B. near Moncton, and roared along the Trans-Canada Highway and a rail line. Water bombing planes were brought into play in an attempt to extinguish the blaze.

Firefighters, meanwhile, were continuing their battle to subdue a blaze near Petticoat, N.B. which sprang from a municipal dump Tuesday and had devoured more than 800 acres of scrub and secondary timber.

Ten fires were reported at various spots in Nova Scotia. The largest was at Wall Lake in Shelburne County, where water bombers were used to bring a 25-acre blaze under control.

Three fires were reported in Halifax County, two in Queens and Hants Counties and one each in Lunenburg and Kings Counties.

Chief Electoral Officer Lorne Monkley said yesterday that the death of Mr. Acorn necessitates a withdrawal of the grant of poll thereby cancelling the May 30 voting in the 1st district of Kings. This includes both the election of councillor and assemblyman in that district.

The Election Act provides for a new polling day, within three months of the death of a candidate.

Candidates in 1st Kings were, Mr. Acorn and Daniel MacDonald for the Liberals and Peter McAulay and Keith MacKenzie for the Conservatives.

**ELECTED IN 1961**

Mr. Acorn was first elected to the P.E.I. Legislative Assembly as assemblyman in the general election of 1961. He was re-elected in 1965. In the general election he was defeated by his Conservative opponent, the late John R. MacLean. He ran again against Mr. MacLean in 1962 and was again defeated. He was re-elected to the Legislative Assembly in a by-election in February, 1965.

Mr. Acorn was an automobile dealer, operating a sub-agency in Souris for a Charlottetown dealer. He was a member of the Eastern Kings Board of

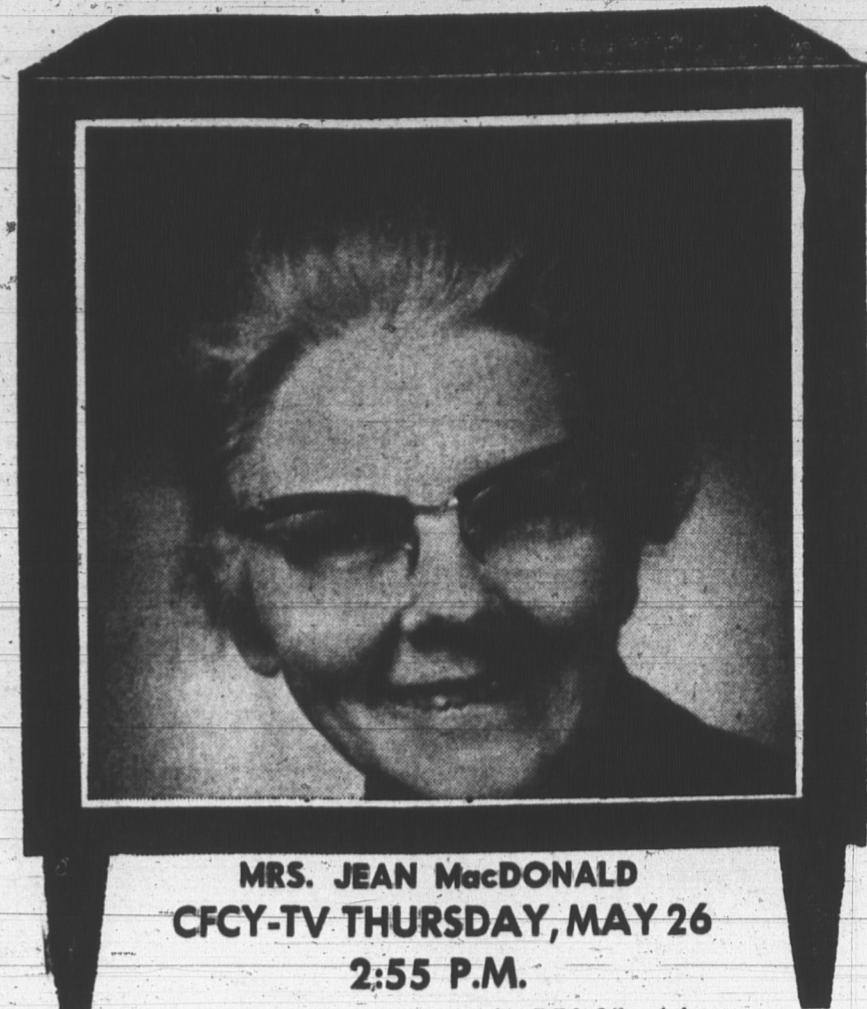
