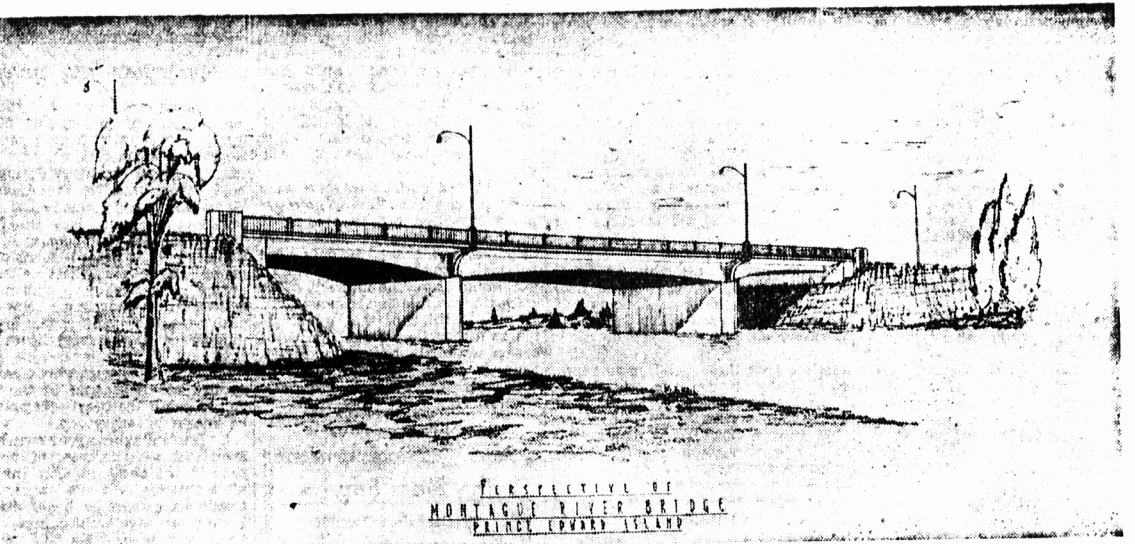
Named Assistant Health Officer
