Mocktails were very popular with all Freshmen, with the SDES and Panther Piss on top.

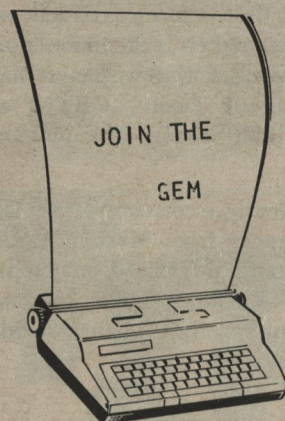

## UPEI United Nations

Since 1982, UPEI, through the Political Studies Dept., has participated annually in a Model United Nations simulation in New York City during Easter Weekend.

Over the past seven years we have simulated countries from Africa, Latin America, Asia, and Eastern Europe. The delegates have played a diplomatic role in every committee or organization simulated.

In the past, UPEI has usually sent about 25 students each year. This year, we are expecting to expand the UPEI delegation to 35. We are hoping to represent two countries: one from the First World (Spain, Greece, or Australia as examples) and one from the Third World (ie. Brazil, Nigeria, or India).

Any interested students who wish to become part of the delegation must be fully committed to the course (Political Studies 462) and must participate in all activities such as fund raising and meetings. Students will learn a great deal from this course such

as studying the history and charter of the United Nations, practicing debating techniques, drafting resolutions and policy papers, learning the history, policies and economics of the country represented, studying how diplomatic blocs, such as Asia and Africa, work in a committee, and finally, how to think and act like a delegate of the particular country.

The major fund raising event is the annual banquet - this year to be held on Friday, March 6 1989. This year we are very pleased to have a distinguished guest speaker - Noam Choamsky.

The Model UN course accepts students from most departments. We encourage any interested students to attend the organizational and information meeting on Monday, September 26 at 6:00 in the Robertson Library (watch for posters for precise location). Application forms will be handed out at this meeting.
