

CURRENT NOTES.

The ex-Empress Eugenie is said to have recognized Prince Jerome as head of the Bonapartist family.

Mr. B. Russel, one of the best reporters in Canada has retired from the office of Chief reporter of the Nova Scotia assembly.

Three hundred Methodist boards have so far reported on the union question, 277 for the basis and 23 against. This makes the aggregate vote 3,498 for the union and 563 against.

The Inman Steamship Co. have received a verdict in their action for damages against the owners of the steamer "Kirby Hall," which sunk the "City of Brussels" at the entrance to the Mersey.

The negro who is now awaiting trial at St. John for killing his wife, is 36 years old and was born a slave in Virginia. He says that he will plead guilty. His wife was only 16 years old when he married her.

SECURITY advices state that mountaineers attacked a Turkish guard-house at that place in revenge for the death of two of their comrades. They were repulsed after an obstinate fight in which twenty Turks were killed and wounded.

The Toronto World is informed that Mr. Gordon Brown has entered an action against the Globe Printing Company, claiming five thousand dollars damage for wrongful dismissal. It is understood that the Globe people are trying to prevent the case coming to trial, but that Mr. Brown is determined to fight the matter out.

The most distressing incident in connection with the floods in the United States occurred at Louisville, a few nights ago. Just about midnight the dam protecting the low lands in the eastern part of the city broke, letting sixty feet of water upon twenty blocks of dwellings. An awful scene ensued, during which some thirty lives were lost.

Sir John Macdonald taught Mr. Blake a lesson Friday night. Mr. Blake said that Ontario was unduly represented in the Cabinet. If this be so, said the Premier, it was his best vindication against a cry that had been industriously raised against him by Mr. Mowat and his lieutenants, Messrs. Fraser and Hardy, who represented Mr. Meredith as a slave to Sir John Macdonald, and Sir John Macdonald a slave to the Lower Canadians. If he were under French domination as represented, he would not unduly favour Ontario. If Ontario was unduly favored, there was no "domination." This left Mr. Blake on the horns of a dilemma.

The gold mines of Keewatin are making some stir in Winnipeg. The situation of these mines is near Rat Portage on the north shore of the Lake of the Woods. The tendency among the promoters is to organize mining companies with large capital. At least three with a million dollars each and one with double that amount are mentioned. The question is whether this spreading out is not premature. The first thing to be done in gold mining is to ascertain the average yield by crushing on a large scale and to trace the leads so as to be able to make a reliable estimate of all the gold in the claim. While this is being done, only a moderate amount of capital should be subscribed—enough to prove these facts—it is soon enough to talk about millions when the promoters are in possession of this information. Eastern people who neglect their own gold mines, are not likely to get excited over those of Keewatin.

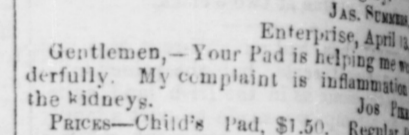
