A SATISFACTORY meeting of the Ocean Steamship Company was held last evening. After the routine business, a resolution was unanimously carried, extending the partnership of the Company. Notice of the steamer's spring trip will be found in our advertising columns.

In the absence of information from London, there was no important business to transact, and the meeting, therefore adjourned.

A PRINCIPAL manufacturer writes us in reference to the price of axes as follows: "Axes have not been advanced in price by manufacturers since the National Policy went into force. They are in fact from 2 1/2 to 5 per cent. less than in 1878. You may safely so state on the authority of one of them."
