

The cricketers calling themselves the "Canadian team" are playing in England and Scotland, but on their appearance they were discredited. A paragraph in the papers says they are composed of three natives of the United States, seven Englishmen, and but five real Canadians. The paragraph continues: "Every honest cricketer in Canada scorns the team as ridiculous." The newspapers are all down on the undertaking, and hope steps may be taken to prevent their playing as representatives of Canada. Their only hope is that they may collar sufficient gate money to pay expenses and secure an enjoyable pleasure trip. There is not one of them, unless it be Kearney, of Halifax, who plays well enough to be in a second eleven of country 'colts.' Therefore their reception has not been enthusiastic. A denouement was reached when Jordan was apprehended at Leicester on the 3rd, on the information of Sergt. Strange, charged with desertion from the 2nd Royal Horse Guards. His name is said to be Thos. Dale. Since his alleged desertion, he has been in Canada eight years, and held the captaincy of several clubs. He is married, and has several children. In the Police Court, at Leicester, on the 4th, Dale, alias Jordan, was charged with desertion since Nov., 1872. A Sergeant of the same regiment identified defendant, and produced his description. The defendant admitted the correctness of the charge, and was remanded to await an escort.
