BOND MARKET

By THE CANADIAN PRESS Prices were mixed in moderate trading this week on the Canadian Bond Market. Short term Canada issues moved to higher levels. The 3 1/2-per-cent, May 1, 1966, issue closed at \$99.45 bid and \$99.55 asked. The long-term market closed stronger this week with the 5 1/2-per-cent, May 1, 1960, issue quoted at \$97 bid and \$97 1/2 asked. Day-to-day money closed at 3 1/2 per cent. Amount available was \$225,000,000 compared with \$201,000,000 last week. Treasury bills were virtually unchanged. The province of Ontario, 5 1/2-per-cent, Oct. 15, 1965, issue closed at \$97 1/2 bid and \$98 1/2 asked. Corporate and municipal trading was quiet with few price changes.
