

Body Of Missing Man Washes Up On Shore

The finding of the body of Cyril Johnston on the shore at Guesery Cove directly below the school yesterday morning about 8 o'clock, brought to a close a widespread air and sea search which had been carried out since early Tuesday.

Mr. Johnston, 46, owner of the Mabou Drug Company of Montague, had left port at Montague in his 18-foot sailboat "The Ghost" Sunday evening for a weekend sail, and concern for his safety was not immediately felt until he failed to return home on Monday. His boat has not been located.

He was found by Loomer Herring who was gathering Irish moss along the shore. The body was fully clothed except for shoes. A life jacket was secured by the boat and a jacket was found on the shore a short distance away.

Mr. Johnston's untimely death came as a shock to his family, friends and business associates. He will be remembered as a person deeply interested in his community, such interest being evident in his work in the R.O.Y. Canadian Legion of which he was an active member. He was a town council member, and many other organizations such as the Montague Curling Club to which he donated a schoolboy curling trophy and the Montague Little League baseball club which he assisted in obtaining equipment.

Mr. Johnston was born at Portmure where he received his early education, following which he graduated from Prince of Wales College before entering the Royal Canadian Air Force. He gained the rank of flight-lieutenant and served as a pilot instructor. His service was recognized when he received the oak leaf and was mentioned in dispatches in the Queen's birthday honours list.

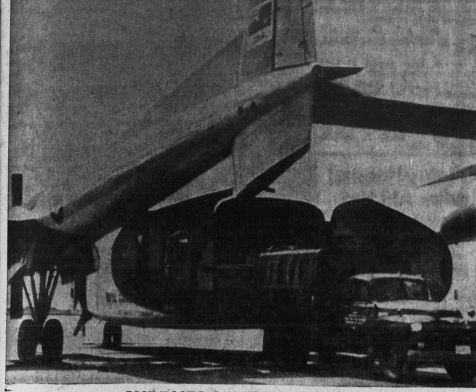
