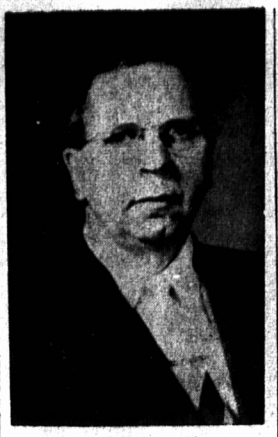

toria Park by the new type mercury-filament lamp, thus adding greatly to making our Park very attractive to our Centennial visitors, as did also a Trailer Camp located in the centre of our Park, and the making of the old powder magazine into a museum at Fort Edward. Here again, in conjunction with our Centennial year, a plaque in commemoration of Fort Edward was unveiled by Commissioner L. H. Nicholson, head of the R. C. M. P.

"The East end of our City was also the scene of much activity by the Irving Oil Company, and the Imperial Oil Limited, in the erection of storage tanks to look after the needs of our people in both gasoline and fuel oil.

"The year also saw the official opening of the new T. Eaton building, which is definitely an asset to our City.

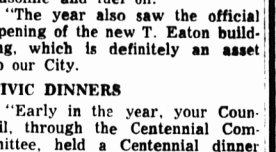
CIVIC DINNERS "Early in the year, your Council, through the Centennial Committee, held a Centennial dinner honouring all former living Mayors, Water Commissioners, and Councillors. This was followed by a Civic dinner honouring the members of the Provincial Legislature. This was further followed by a Civic dinner, entertaining all the merchants doing business in our City over fifty years.

"A Civic dinner in honour of Mayor Charlotte Whitton of Ottawa was also held on May 21st. Our Maritime Fire Chief's Convention and our Police Chief's Convention were also held during the year, and were both overwhelmingly successful. I could say that all the Conventions held were most successful, but I mention these two in particular, because they definitely lie in with City Hall. The heads of these two departments are of necessity elected by the citizens, as they are Councillors.
