Thoughts For Our Time

By His Eminence Cardinal McGuigan (Copyright) Any person who has been following recent history cannot help but make the judgment that we live in a very muddled world.

This is a resperate situation, because it indicates that we live in an intellectual vacuum, an air pocket of the mind. This is a very perilous state for high-flying man, because it is doubtful that the laws of human gravitation are going to be suspended in order to accommodate him and guarantee him safety.

Of course, once we adopt this policy, there are certain things that necessarily follow in its wake. If we don't know what to think, obviously we don't know what to do. Our acting depends on our thinking. Right and wrong mean something only if there is a true and a false. The same holds true for the terms better and worse.

It is this situation also which allows for a foreign policy which vacillates from one extreme to the other. Not only individual persons, but countries and nations, don't know what they want. When you don't know what you want, good salesmen, be they purveyors of wares or international charlatans, expert in the confidence game, can usually pass off on you something which, when you get it, you discover you definitely don't want.

There was the equivalent of the Ph.D. in the days of Christ. He was the Scribe whom Christ called "the blind leader of the blind." There were also his friends, the Pharisees, variously called "a brood of vipers" and "whited sepulchres".

It often happens that middle-headed people are good hearted. The dollar diplomacy of the Americans was, to a very great extent, motivated by native generosity; and it resulted in insult to the beneficiaries. It has made
