St. Pierre Fishing Project Is Causing Canadian Concern

HALIFAX (CP) - Fishermen in Eastern Canada are casting uneasy glances at the French islands of St. Pierre-Miquelon off the southern tip of Newfoundland.

The European Economic Community is studying plans for a \$3,000,000 base on the islands for fishing craft belonging to members and other countries.

Plans for the base, as announced by the EEC, are reported in the United States concerning fisheries review, call for a \$3,000,000 investment from the EEC's overseas development fund to improve harbor and fish receiving facilities.

Among those concerned is Ocean Fisheries Limited of Nova Scotia whose president C. J. Morrow, said the base could have a detrimental effect on the market of Canadian fish.

"Reports to date indicate that the development is not intended to produce frozen fillets for the European market," he said.
