Pick Site To Study F. And M. Disease

HARTFORD, Conn., July 10 — (AP) — U.S. Department of Agriculture representatives announced today that Plum Island, New York State territory eight miles off the Connecticut shore at New London, has been chosen as a "preferred site" for a \$10,000,000 laboratory to study foot-and-mouth disease, an ailment affecting cattle.

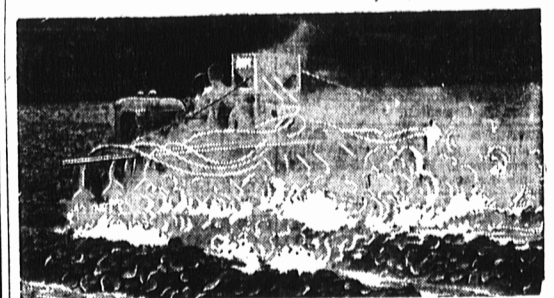
