Local and Other Items.

A REGULAR HABIT.—A Newark woman has brought suit against her husband on the complaint that in twelve years he had blackened her eyes seventy-two times or six times every year. Here was a man whose conduct was almost phenomenally regular and still his wife complains.

AN OLD POSTMAN.—David Ramsay, a postman in Thrums, Scotland, has just resigned his position at the age of eighty, because of physical ailments. For the 47 years he has been in office he has lost a day from sickness. It is estimated that he has walked 232,000 miles in carrying his mail.

A MERITED TRIBUTE.—The Imperial government has paid a striking tribute to Canadian pluck and valor by offering to accept graduates of the Royal Military College at King's College in the vacancies caused by the casualties among commissioned officers in the regiments at the front. That tribute is well merited. The Canadians who have served in the Imperial forces have given a good account of themselves and their country.

'T WAS A FALSE REPORT.—It is announced that a prominent member of the Hibernians in Ottawa telegraphed President James Noonan, of Division 36, Ancient Order of Hibernians, Worcester, Mass., asking if it was correct that he and other members of the order voted for an invasion of Canada. A reply has been received denying that an occurrence of the kind took place. Mr. Noonan added that the society was purely for fraternal purposes.

INSANE FROM FOOTBALL.—According to a New York despatch Jeremiah Miller, a son of Councilman, Edward B. Miller, of Chatham, N. J., has been adjudged insane and sent to the State hospital at Morris Plain. Miller is an amateur football and baseball player, and during a Thanksgiving day game of football he received a blow on the head. Miller was unconscious for a time and was removed to his home. He improved, and later his actions were peculiar, and a committee was appointed to enquire into his insanity. The doctor decided that his mind had been unaltered by the blow on the head.

A STARTLING LETTER.—Mr. Weldon, the manager of the Windsor, Montreal, received last evening the following communication:

New York City, December 22, 1899.
Sir,—As a private citizen of the United States I ask you do the inhabitants of Canada know for what purpose they are arming? It behooves you as a man in public life to warn them that in a very short time owing to the statesmanship of Lord Salisbury's the diplomatic relations between the United States and England will be disrupted.

The volunteer ambulances worked splendidly. Eight hundred wounded passed through the Chiveley hospitals, from which all the patients were transferred to the hospitals by the morning of Dec. 17.
