

Gangland Convention Ended By Police, Much Speculation

APALACHIN, N.Y. (AP)—Police are wondering whether a new explosion in gangland had been blueprinted by two major criminals who gathered at a remote hillside mansion near here.

Several had been questioned in the barbershop slaying of mobster Albert Anastasia by two masked gunmen in New York last month, police said.

The well-heeled visitors, whose meeting was broken up Thursday by police, insisted host Joseph Barbara was sick and they "just happened to drop in at the same time" to pay respects.

They dropped out under police orders.

Police said the group included racketeers, narcotics peddlars, bookies and some seemingly legitimate businessmen.

Speculation grew that underworld figures might be carving up Anastasia's racket kingdom.

In New York, Deputy Chief Inspector Edward W. Byrne announced a conference to determine whether Anastasia's estate figure in the discussion.

Police elsewhere noted some of the group had been linked to the Mafia, an underworld organiza-
