The death occurred in Charlottetown on June 20th of Miss Alberta A. Martin of Montague in her 74th year.

The late Miss Martin was the daughter of the late Daniel and Martha Alice (Atkinson) Martin of Montague where she spent the greater part of her life. She was assistant postal clerk in the Montague Post Office for over twenty years.

In her early life she took an active part in church work and in the Rebekah Lodge. At the time of her death she was a member of ACME Rebekah Lodge, Montague and a member of ACME Past Noble Grands Club.

She leaves to mourn one sister, Mrs. Novella Cumming of Rothesay, N.B., and several nieces and nephews. Four sisters and two brothers predeceased her.

Her remains will rest at the home of her nephew, Mr. Archie Hilchey, Montague, until Sunday afternoon when funeral service will be held from Trinity United Church at 2:30 p.m. Interment will be in the Lower Montague Cemetery.
