LET'S EAT Three Unusual Entrees From Nutritious Cheese

"Because cheese is a concentrated and compact food, it should always be served with some bulky food to prevent eating too fast of too much," I said.

"Well put, Madame," observed the Chef. "That is one reason why the Italians combine spaghetti with cheese, the British serve cheese with biscuits, the Hollanders enjoy cheese with dark bread for breakfast and the French accompany cheese with fruit and crusty bread for dessert service."

QUICK, EASY ENTRÉE

As Cheddar (or American) cheese is almost identical with meat, nutritionally speaking, the Chef and I have worked out three quick-and-easy entrees based on tasty natural Swiss or sharp Cheddar cheese and ready-to-bake biscuits. Less meat than usual is needed.

TOMORROW'S DINNER

Lettuce-String Bean-Salads

Meat-Biscuit Bake

Quick Cabbage Carrot Rounds

Strawberry Cream Pie

Coffee Tea Milk

All measurements are level; recipes proportioned to serve 4-6.

Meat-Biscuit Bake: Oil a square baking pan. Over the bottom press the contents 1 pkg. ready-to-bake biscuits. Bake 12 min. in

a hot oven, 450 degrees F.

Meantime, lightly sauté 1 lb. chopped beef and 1-3 c. chopped onion, seasoned with ½ tsp. salt and ¼ tsp. pepper.

Next, remove the biscuits from the oven. Spread with the meat mixture. Top with the contents 1 (8 oz.) pkg. sharp Cheddar cheese slices and 1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce.

Bake 10 min. more in a very hot oven, 450 degrees F., or until the cheese melts and the sauce bubbles.

Frankfurters Deluxe: Open 1 pkg. ready-to-bake biscuits. Press into finger shapes, the length of a skinless frankfurter. Spread with horseradish mustard.

Cut 2-3 of a pkg. (8 oz.) natural Swiss cheese slices in 5 strips. Slip the frankfurters lengthwise (allow one for each biscuit) and each with a strip of the cheese and place on a biscuit. Secure with pins.

Bake 10 min. in a very hot oven, 450 degrees F., or until the biscuits are browned. Remove pieces before serving.

Little Chef Biscuit Bake: Place the contents 1 pkg. ready-to-bake biscuits in an oiled 9" square baking pan. Bake 12 min. in a very hot oven, 450 degrees F.

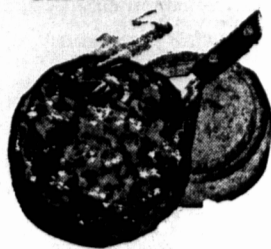
