ARCTIC FIND REPORTED

Discovery Of Ancient Tools Fills Gap In Eskimo History

OTTAWA (CP) — Discoveries of 4,000-year-old Eskimo tools on Banks and Victoria islands last summer have filled in one vital gap in the early history of North America's eskimos but Dr. William Taylor is afraid some other clues are lost beneath the Arctic Ocean.

archaeologist of Canada's National Museum said in an interview. "Some of the key sites now may be under several feet of water." The discovery of ancient knives, spearheads, needles and other tools in the southwest corner of Canada's Arctic islands gives strong support to the theory of Eskimo migration held by most archaeologists.

found what we were looking for." The spearheads, knives, hide scrapers and other stone artifacts were about two feet underground. "We also found a concentration of muskox skulls indicating the Eskimos must have dragged the animals back to camp." That would have been quite a chore because the Eskimos of that period didn't use dogs for transportation.

OBITUARY

TRACE PRE-DORSET
"The first wave — the pre-Dorset culture — started from Alaska about 3,000 B.C. (About 5,000 years ago) and reached Greenland about 1,000 years later," the bearded, 38-year-old archaeologist said. He inhabited the Arctic until the second wave—the Dorset culture — started moving westward about 800 B.C. Then came the Thule culture, about 900 A.D., and finally the recent central Eskimo culture, dating back roughly to the arrival of the Europeans in the Arctic. But while traces of the pre-Dorset culture had been found in Alaska and the eastern Arctic, there was a big gap from near the Alaska border to the central section of the southern Arctic islands where no traces of their existence had been found.

Dr. Taylor believes his discoveries have filled part of that gap. His first find was on Victoria Island where he uncovered an old campsite and found a crude copper knife—which he believes is the oldest metal object ever found in Canada's Arctic.

Double Negative Helps Trap Former Missionary Brother

NEW YORK (AP)—A double negative has helped in the undoing of a defrocked Roman Catholic missionary brother. Police said he defrauded Roman Catholic parishes and convents in the United States of more than \$150,000 in the last 10 years.

Joseph Horowski, 62, who used the religious title of Brother Joseph Damian, collected contributions for "home for the aged and incurable men." When the flow of contributions to his mail "drops" fell off, he would appear at churches dressed as a priest or religious brother and collect money.

Horowski made his slip Feb. 8 last when he wrote a letter to the mother superior of the Servants of the Holy Infancy of Jesus in North Plainfield, N.J. In the course of a plaintive appeal for the poor, he ventured the thought that "it will not do no danger."

TIPPED AUTHORITIES
That was one "no" too many for the mother superior. She notified church authorities, notified postal inspectors and a search for Brother Damian was started.

Two months later, a suspicious assistant pastor at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Roman Catholic church in Bayonne, N.J., caught Horowski making unauthorized collections at the church. Police were called and he was arrested on charges of making false solicitations. Horowski jumped bail and

Lead-Zinc Ore Testing Starts

NEW YORK (AP)—New Jersey Zinc Co. has announced it was starting test work on a 3,000,000-ton body of zinc-lead ore in northern New Brunswick, 70 miles west of Bathurst. If test results are satisfactory, Teck Corp. Ltd., holder of extensive mining and oil interests in Canada, will finance a \$5,000,000 mine-mill complex on the site, New Jersey Zinc said. The ore is reported to average about 12 per cent combined zinc and lead, with values in copper, silver and gold. It is close enough to the surface to allow open-pit mining at the early stages. Tentative plans call for construction of a 1,000-ton a day concentrator.

QUALIFICATIONS
The Federal Department of Fisheries requires a university graduate or a person possessing an equivalent combination of education and training, with many years of vocational training experience. He must have a good knowledge of the principles and practices of adult education and possess oral and written communicative skill, tact and diplomacy.

DUTIES
To develop throughout Canada a fisheries vocational training programme. In carrying out this programme it will be necessary to consult with industry and Federal and Provincial authorities responsible for vocational training and fisheries development; to plan and develop suitable courses of study; and to arrange training programmes for foreign students.
