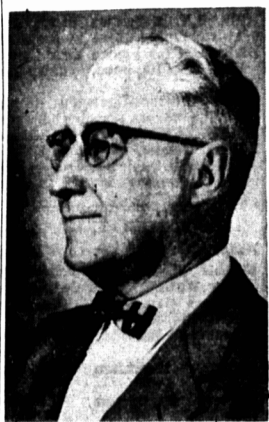
What can be done about youngsters who become the despair of their parents by showing a total lack of respect for their own clothing?

Now I'm no child expert, and I haven't heard of any magic formula for making kids take care of their clothes. But I have a hunch that some of these tendencies might decrease if parents made sure their youngsters had not merely a proper place for their clothes, but a handy one, and one that is even fun for them to use.

I think one of the most elementary principles is to make sure the youngsters have ample closets and a drawer space that is within their own reach. The best way to provide this, usually, is to buy one of those children's wardrobes, complete with miniature closet space and drawers (they're not very expensive if you buy them unpainted and paint them yourself).

And then there are various types of novelty coat trees which you can buy or build yourself. As I say, I'm no child psychologist, but it strikes me that the youngster who has his own closet and other storage facilities is more likely to take pride in putting his things away—at least some of the time. From then on, I would think it would be up to the parents to make sure that discipline and patience are combined to make this practice a regular habit.

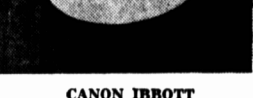
