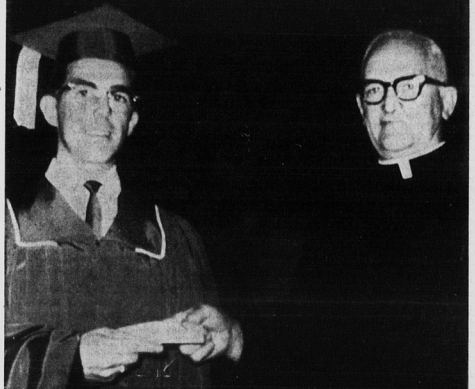
SELECTED
