When Mowat and Mills Go to Their Reward.

Bad Break in Soulanges Canal.

SPLIT AMONG THE OTTAWA GRITS.

Clothing for Our Brave Militiamen.

OTTAWA, Oct. 29.—Sir Oliver Mowat will be sworn in as Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, and Senator Mills as Minister of Justice, about the middle of November—likely on the 15th.

THE FIGHTING IN INDIA.

Colonel Sage Wounded by Fire at Long Range.

SIMLA, Oct. 29.—A despatch from Yundun says that during a reconnaissance yesterday at the foot of Semphaga Pass by the Devonshire regiment and a detachment of Ghoorkas, the insurgent tribesmen opened fire upon the British forces at long range. Colonel Sage was wounded.

Archbishop Langevin Improving.

WINNIPEG, Oct. 29.—Archbishop Langevin, who had a relapse, is again reported on the mend. His condition, it is said, is steadily improving.

DEATH OF HENRY GEORGE.

Fell in the Midst of the Fight

The Situation as to the Mayoralty of New York Greatly Changed.

NEW YORK, Oct. 29.—Henry George died at Union Square Hotel at 7 o'clock this morning.

After speaking at several campaign meetings last night he returned to the Hotel. At 11 o'clock he ate a light supper and retired. About 3:30 o'clock he awoke suffering severe pains and became unconscious. He did not recover consciousness.

The situation in the great election contest is by Mr. George's death completely changed.

Newfoundland Elections.

St. JOHN'S, Nfld., Oct. 29.—The result of yesterday's voting for members of the Legislative assembly may not be known before next week. It is likely to have been very close.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON, Oct. 27.—Mr. Gladstone in the course of a letter to a Viennese author which has just been published here, laments the megalomania which has led Italy to strain her resources to go beyond the European province marked out for her during her national infancy, and which may perhaps endanger her dearly bought institutions. Referring to the condition of affairs in the east Mr. Gladstone says: "My views on the conduct of the European Governments in the Eastern question are very strong. They seem to me to be covered with indelible disgrace. The German Emperor is the first and worst among them."

HARD FIGHTING IN STORE.

Tribesmen Have Massed Twenty Thousand Men at Semphaga Pass in India.

SIMLA, Oct. 27.—It is estimated that the tribesmen have massed 20,000 men at Semphaga Pass, where they are busy making rifle pits in the Sangars and strengthening their defences. It is generally believed, however, that it will be possible to turn the position by either flank, and though hard fighting is possibly in store, it is hoped the pass will be carried without great effort.

Meanwhile, it is bad news that tribesmen have begun to operate on the British lines of communication. The fear is that, finding this the most successful means of delaying the British advance, they will detach still larger bodies to attack the British convoys and cut up the escorts. This morning the tribesmen harassed the British camp near Khangabur by a constant well-directed fire for several hours. Nearly thirty non-commissioned officers and men were slightly wounded. The telegraph wire was cut close to the camp.

A picturesque but unfortunate incident occurred on the Shinawari side of the Samana range. A party of Gorkhas, sent out under Lieutenant Milland, had crept close upon a large body of the enemy. Just at this moment, through some mistake, magnesium star shells were fired from the British camp and revealed the whole situation, enabling the enemies to escape unhurt.

Replying to the proclamation of the British commander of the frontier, Sir William Lockhart, the Mazozais protest against the occupation of Khyber Pass, Samana Range and the Swat Valley, by the British forces. They declare their intention of opposing the British advance. The Mazozais leaders are now at Khurmans, and are preparing to attack the Kurram Valley. A letter was received from these raiders, asking the British if their intentions were peace or war. The Mikand position has been greatly strengthened, and is now capable of stubborn resistance. The British foragers have captured in the Khanki Aalley 300 mules, laden with supplies.
