East's hand turned out to be instrumental in defeating four hearts, though it is a little hard to see how his array of cards could be of value in this hand. South made the proper choice of doubling a spade after North and East had passed. Sitting in the protective position after the bidding had died at one spade, South realized it was more important for him first to identify general strength than to show the heart suit immediately. A direct overall of two hearts would have indicated only a desire to compete for the part score. It would ordinarily be based on a hand of less than opening bid strength.

North correctly raised to three.

Argue Demands Expansion Fund

OTTAWA (CP)—A \$2,000,000 capital expansion fund, administered by a new federal department of planning and development, was proposed Monday by Hazen Argue, CCF House Leader.

He put forward the ear-catching ideas during the Commons budget debate as he criticized Finance Minister Fleming for "a fence-sitting, in-between, stand-pat budget."

"Now is the time to embark on a great program of development," Mr. Argue said.

He said fresh capital funds should be put into a new national highway system, educational and hospital facilities and into providing competition for private enterprise through publicly-owned corporations in the banking, steel, chemical, fertilizer and drug industries.

SOCIAL SECURITY

As for social security, Mr. Argue called for a basic old age pension of at least \$75 a month plus a system of contributory retirement pensions.

Establishment of a new planning and development department needn't mean expansion of the cabinet, he said. State Secretary Courtemanche and Solicitor-General Balcer both were "under-employed" and there was room for amalgamation there.

Paul Martin (L—Essex East) also entered the sixth day of the budget debate, to attack Mr. Fleming as the first finance minister to have presented three peacetime deficits in a row, including one that was the biggest peacetime in Canada's history.

MISREPRESENTATION

Mr. Martin said Mr. Fleming misrepresented the deficit in the 1958-59 fiscal year ended March 31 by reporting it as \$617,000,000 when it actually was \$835,000,000. By "manipulation" of his figures to liquidate a \$218,000,000 defence equipment account he had reported the lower figure.

By the end of the current fiscal year next April 1, Mr. Fleming would have piled up a total of \$1,300,000,000 in deficits on three successive budgets.

Attendance of about 60 members during the afternoon sitting was slightly better than that earlier in the budget debate which ends Wednesday. At some times last week attendance shrank to as few as 25 members.

Mr. Martin said the brief reference in the budget to unemployment demonstrates that the government is not giving proper consideration to measures to alleviate it during next fall and winter. There was every indication it would be as serious as the 538,000 recorded at mid-January.

Augustin Brassard (L—Lapointe) said residents of Quebec would welcome provincial participation in various federal assistance programs now rejected by Premier Duplessis as endangering provincial rights. Such participation would give Quebecers a chance to recover some of the money they pay in federal taxes but are currently losing.

Steel Output To Increase

HAMILTON (CP)—The Steel Company of Canada Monday announced plans to increase capacity of its Hamilton works by almost 25 per cent in the next two years.

H. G. Hilton, chairman and chief executive officer, told the company's annual meeting, together with improvements and additions to rolling and processing equipment would raise the company's annual ingot capacity from its present 2,350,000 tons to 2,900,000 tons.

No new financing for the expansion was contemplated, Mr. Hilton said the cost of the program was not revealed.
