## Diabetes Control Plans Suggested

A new method of tracking down unsuspected cases of diabetes will be recommended to the provincial government, Charles Praught, administrator of the P.E.I. diabetic control plan, said yesterday.

The method lies in the hunt for diabetes with the tuberculin control program and has met with great success where it has been practiced in Newfoundland, Mr. Praught said.

Mr. Praught's department, together with the P.E.I. Diabetic Association, will recommend this new procedure to the government and he is hopeful it will be adopted.

Under the scheme, persons who attend X-ray clinics, people who are asked to leave a urine sample at the time the urine sample would be forwarded to department laboratories where tests would confirm or deny the presence of diabetes.
