March 5, 1972

The first meeting of the '72/'73 Student Council was held in the Panther Lounge of the Barn at 7:20 P.M. Members present were Pat Duffy, Norbert Moran, Bob Gray, Len McCurdle, Bruce Grosse, Rosemary Curley, Lea Kelly, Bruce Ogilvie, Kelburn Place, Ruth Milligan.

I. Bob Gray presented a proposal to council concerning the need for public transportation. This proposal is to be further researched and presented to the next meeting of Council.

II. Bob Gray moved and Norbert Moran seconded the proposal concerning the admission of the Chinese Student Association as a budget receiving member of the Student Council until the next meeting. Motion carried.

III. Norbert Moran moved and Bob Gray seconded that the Film Society of the Student Union be reviewed and the Film Section of the Social Committee to serve as the basis of this society. Motion carried.

IV. Bob Gray moved and Len McCurdle seconded that the location of the council meetings rotate between the residence and Barn to involve more students in council meetings. Motion carried.

V. Norbert Moran moved and Len McCurdle seconded that applications for Committees close Wednesday March 15, 1972. Motion carried.

VI. Norbert Moran moved and Pat Duffy seconded that an advertising committee be formed to co-ordinate campus publicity. Motion carried.

VII. Norbert Moran and Bob Fray informed council of the summer school residence proposals, and council appointed Pat Duffy and Norbert Moran to consult with the administration concerning this matter.

Other Business

I. The Cadre staff presented a proposal requesting \$50.00 Honoraria for Ronald Kelly, Eddie Gardiner, Rick O'Brian, Norbert Moran, Bob Gray and Bill MacIntyre. Moran and Gray asked that their names be removed from the list.

II. Leo Kelly presented a discussion concerning next year's \$5.00 parking fee and informed the council that reserved parking spaces will be made available for those willing to pay an extra fee.
