

Molotov Is Rehabilitated After 8 Years In Doghouse

LONDON (AP) — East European diplomats reported Friday that Vyacheslav M. Molotov has been rehabilitated after eight years in the political doghouse and now is working behind the scenes as Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin's personal adviser on foreign affairs.

These Communist informants stressed that the former foreign minister, 75, who was Stalin's right-hand man, has no official post. But they said he is being consulted by Kosygin not only on foreign policy but on some economic matters as well.

They said Molotov had an important role in preparing the new economic program which Kosygin outlined to the Soviet Communist Party's Central Committee Sept. 27.

BROKE WITH NIKITA
Reports received here from Moscow recently said Molotov was called before the party presidium in September and told of the decision to abolish regional planning commissions gradually. It was over the question of decentralization of agriculture the Molotov broke with Khrushchev in 1956 and 1957.

The new program announced by Kosygin in September reversed some of Khrushchev's economic policies. Molotov, foreign minister from 1939 to 1949, was ousted by Khrushchev along with former premiers Nikolai Bulganin and George Malenkov, former economic minister Lazar Kaganovich and former foreign minister Dmitri Shepilov. Molotov was sent away as ambassador to Mongolia, virtually an exile post. Three years later he was named Soviet representative to the International Atomic Energy Agency in Vienna, a tremendous fall

25 To 54-Year-Old Group Is Decisive Voting Force

OTTAWA (CP) — This time they are casting a slightly smaller shadow but people in the 30-year age span from 25 to 54 still form the decisive voting force for Monday's federal election, as they have in every countrywide vote since 1921, the first year for universal suffrage at 21 in Canada.

They make up 63.5 per cent of the people of voting age, when they hit their high of 68.6 per cent. The previous low was 64.1 per cent in 1941 and their proportion in the 1963 election was 64.2 per cent.

and population estimates of various age groups. There are wide differences between number of eligibles on voters' lists and the population in the voting age group, 21 and over.

Detail announced this week on the latest available population estimate, shows 10,976,500 Canadians 21 and over at last June 1. The preliminary voters list for Monday's election listed 10,191,825 eligible voters. Final official figures won't be known for months, but revisions may bring the total to around 10,250,000.
