Religion and Life

Christmas bells are ringing. The gladness of the festive season is in the air. It is due to the announcement of what God has done for our salvation. St. Luke calls it "good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord."

A Scandinavian writer illustrates it this way: "This message means what the word of Hitler's downfall meant to the conquered Danish and Norwegian people. Word that Hitler had been destroyed in Germany came to these people as a thrilling message, as good news. It meant deliverance from the occupying power, freedom, joy. "Those who experienced those days, and that sensation of jubilation which gripped all because of that message, have therein an illustration of what a message, an overwhelming story of good news, joyful news, really is." God has acted on our behalf. God has entered the human conflict in the person of

His Son. A new era has dawned in the dealings of God with man. It is all coming to pass because the powers of the Kingdom of God came into human life with the King and are at the command of the faith of His subjects. Christ's saying: "All things are possible to him who believes" is true in a deeper sense than the church has ever realized.

Enemy Within
There is one defect, however, in our ordinary illustrations of savagery—they assume that the deliverance we need is from an enemy who attacks us from without. This is true, but only a part of the truth. Sin does put man in the power of the enemy. A business man in a western city had just taken over a new office with new responsibilities when he received a call from a stranger who proposed certain dealings with his firm. Just after the man left, he noticed an open envelope on his desk and saw that it contained a sum of money. He rushed out and caught his visitor just as he was entering the elevator and compelled him to take that money back. He said: "If I had kept that money I should have been completely in that man's power." Sin often betrays the sinner into the power of forces or persons who want to use him for their ends so that he is no longer free. There is also the guilt of sin, and before a just God "the wages of sin is death." The coming of Christ into one's life does deliver him from the bondage of sin in all its forms. The liberty with which Christ makes man free is one of the first experiences of the Christian life.

Man's chief enemy, however, is himself. Not only has the sinner done wrong, but he has become the wrong that he did. His whole life is out of joint. All his relationships are poisoned. The glory of Christ's forgiveness and the personal change that follows it is that the man all wrong is made all right. "We have often noticed the sinner: "This means you!" It is difficult for a sinner to believe that the glorious promises of personal renewal are for him, yet that is exactly what Christ intends. "This means you!"

Provides A Goal
A career of personal achievement and widening influence started with Christ came into the life of one who had never shown any interest in the things of the mind and character. Immediately Christ's will for him became his first concern and he started at once to equip himself for Christ's use. Profound learning and masterful leadership has been the result. The cancelling of the past is only the preparation for Christ's place in a career. The Creator creates persons anew: He stands ready to complete the design in His mind when He

brought the person into being. Christ awakens interests, sets up ideals and releases energies in every life that He enters. He gives the redeemed an ideal to attain and a goal to reach, and assures him or her of His presence and help in every effort toward them. Or rather, Christ works in the man and through him toward God's ends, and requires the believer's co-operation for the highest results.

Before St. Augustine's conversion he had been a slave to the passions of his own nature. He failed in effort after effort to shake him-

self free. Then one day he seemed to hear a voice saying: "Take up; and read! Take up and read!" He picked up a copy of Paul's letter to the Romans and read: "Not in revelling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires." For young Augustine "putting on the Lord Jesus Christ" meant immediate emancipation from the evil within and around him, but it meant immeasurably more. It freed one of the mightiest intellects of

all time with a divine enthusiasm. His thinking dominated Christian minds for a thousand years. Christ aims to make men great. The youth who is at this moment weighing Christ's claims has possibilities in himself of which he has never dreamed; Christ is waiting to bring them out and start them in action.

"Though Christ in Bethlehem A thousand times were born, And be not born in thee, Thy soul is still forlorn." Not being born in us He will lift us to levels on which we may walk and work with Him.
