Revive Debate On Winter Navigation To The Lakes

MONTREAL (CP)—Recent research has revived debate on the possibility of year-round navigation on the St. Lawrence river, now closed to ships approximately 3½ months every winter.

Research experts say the river and Great Lakes route could be kept open throughout the year, but at considerable expense. Veteran seamen argue that winter navigation would be hazardous and too costly to help shippers.

Prof. E. R. Pounder, director of McGill University's new Ice Research Project said Monday that year-round navigation on the river would be feasible if:

1. Large capital expenditures were made on improvements designed to conserve the heat of Lake Ontario and direct it into the shipping channel.
2. If a large number of small icebreakers were maintained to keep the shipping channel open.

IRON MOVEMENT

Prof. Pounder in an interview said the development of huge iron ore deposits in northern Quebec has brought year-round navigation closer to reality.

He added:

"When a time arises when iron ore must get to Cleveland and other U. S. Great Lakes smelting centres, the year-round, without boats having to go out into the Atlantic and down the eastern seaboard, then we will go ahead with an ice destruction program.

"This program will involve channeling the relatively warm water of Lake Ontario through the Thousand Islands, where much heat now is dissipated, and utilizing a large number of small icebreakers, about the size of stout motor boats."

The boats would be used to break up surface ice which would move out with the current.

Recently Trevor A. Harwood, a defence research board engineer, said continuous navigation would be possible through the Gulf of St. Lawrence and as far as Rimouski, about 200 miles down-river from Quebec City. Mr. Harwood said such navigation would depend on establishment of proper ice reconnaissance and use of icebreakers. He believed the services could be operated for as little as \$200,000 a year.

ICEBREAKER ESCORTS

In Trois-Rivieres, Que., Paul Marchand, a veteran of 42 years engineering service with Canada Steamship Lines, said in an interview that ships might get up the river as far as Trois-Rivieres during the winter. But they would have to be escorted by icebreakers and this would make shipping expensive.

Shipping between Trois-Rivieres and Montreal was out of the question because of the numerous ice jams which occurred on Lake St. Peter in the St. Lawrence.

Other shipping officials have pointed to experiences of government icebreakers, held up by fog, floating ice, or severe snowstorms. Icebreakers now work at regular intervals throughout the winter to keep the river channel open, but their work is primarily aimed at preventing floods in the Montreal area and at assuring an early opening of the shipping season with the return of spring weather.

Lake Grain Traffic To Resume Soon

FORT WILLIAM, Ont. (CP)—The flow of grain from western Canada to eastern ports, halted by winter ice on the Great Lakes, will resume with the expected arrival here Thursday of a fleet of grain-carrying lake freighters.

The up-bound carriers are being assembled for a voyage across Lake Superior starting Wednesday. They will be accompanied by an icebreaker, and two more icebreakers are standing by to bring them in if necessary to the Lakehead where more than 70,000,000 bushels of the five principal grains are piled in terminal elevators awaiting shipment.

One of the heaviest runs on record is expected for shipments of grain to and from the Lakehead. Grain from the west is reported arriving at the rate of from 200 to 300 cars a day, and elevators are cramped for storage because of a wide variety of grades on hand.

More than 4,500 cars of grain were on hand Monday, awaiting the opening of the shipping season. The total was expected to reach 6,000 by the weekend.
