# Ridan Snared Florida Derby

NEW YORK (CP) — Ridan and Cleada staged a spine-tingling stretch duel in the \$125,000 Florida Derby Saturday with Ridan winning by a nose.

Admiral's Voyage was third and Doctor Hank K. fourth in the field of 11. Cleada was the only filly in the race, run at Gulfstream Park, just outside Miami Beach, Fla.

Stewards called for an inquiry after the two leaders battled through the 81-foot-long stretch. Ridan passed the Meadow Stable's Cleada in the final stride.

The results were declared official 10 minutes later. It was the third of four \$100,000 races in Florida this winter to end in an inquiry.
