NEW STEAMER.—The Weymouth, the new steamer chartered by the Eastern Steamship Company to run to the Eastern shore, arrived here early yesterday morning. 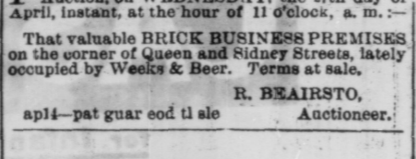
