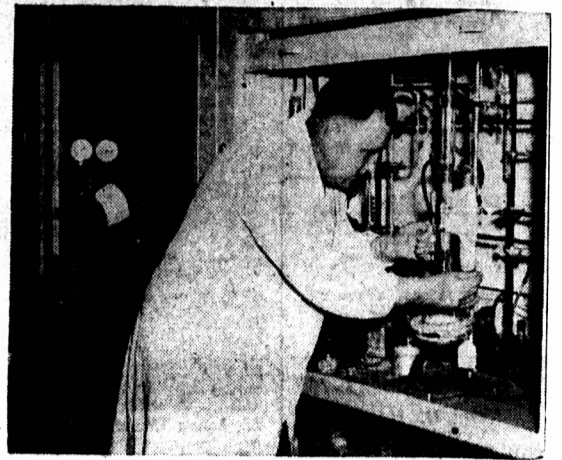

Daniel Keenan, a native of Charlottetown and former student at Prince of Wales College, who has been awarded one of the 15 fellowships offered this year by Canadian Industries Limited for the postgraduate study of chemistry. Mr. Keenan is now studying in the poultry husbandry department of Macdonald College, Ste. Anne de Bellevue, Que., will work toward his master's degree. The C-I-L fellowships open to any British subject who is a graduate of a recognized university or college, were established in 1940 to encourage advanced studies in chemistry. The recipients — 115 fellowships have been awarded to date — are selected by the individual university and may pursue their studies in whatever branch of chemical research they choose under the general guidance of the university. ... 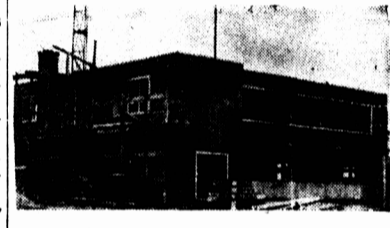

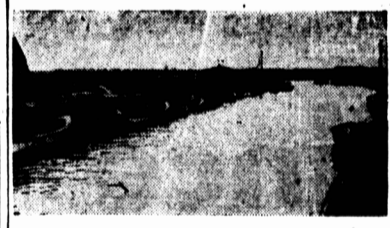

FEDERAL BUILDING — Kensington



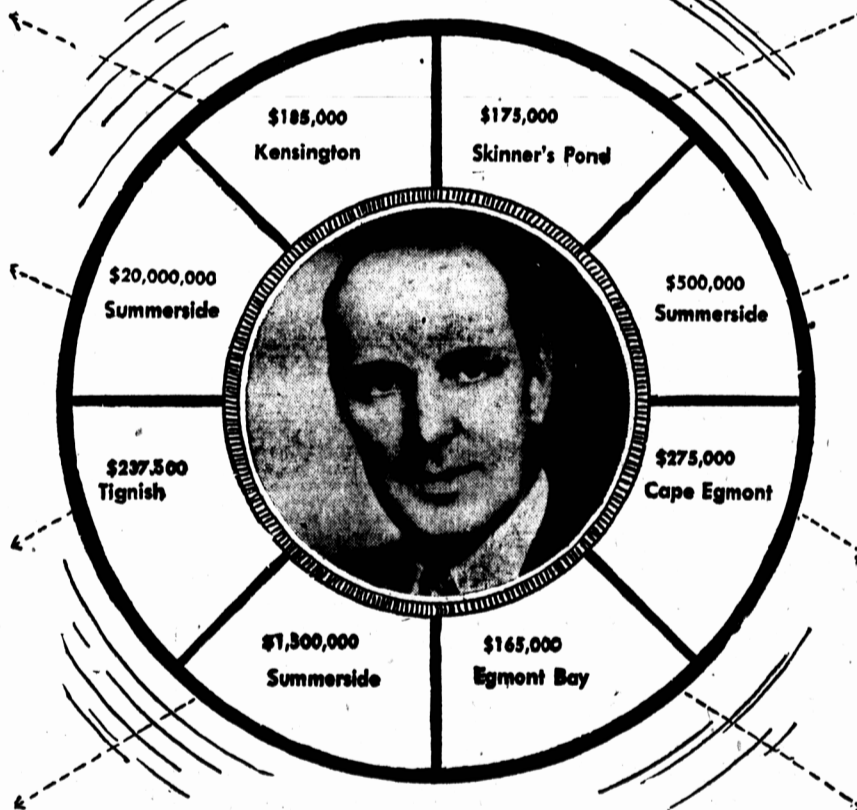

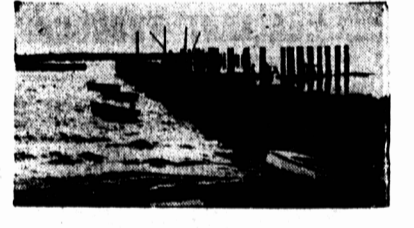
