## LOGO/SYMBOL Contest

You are invited to enter a competition to design a new symbol for "Island Cuisine," a program aimed at developing all aspects of the Prince Edward Island Restaurant Industry.

The three best designs submitted will each win a \$50. prize.

Entries will be judged on their design merit and also on their suitability for use on menus, napkins, placemats, advertisements, etc.

Special attention will be paid to choosing a design which is unique to Prince Edward Island, and suggestive of good food and hospitality. Competitors should bear in mind that the symbol must be designed so that it can be diminished or expanded in size to suit different uses, from 1/2 inch up. The symbol should have NO words, and is limited to a maximum of 2 colours.

Entries should be on 8 x 11 paper, mounted, in a sealed envelope, with no identifying marks. The name, address and phone number of the contestant should appear only on a piece of paper clipped to the outside of the envelope containing the design. Any description of the symbol or explanation of the design should be inside the envelope, and should also carry no identifying marks or names.

The contest will be judged by a panel of restaurant owners and operators, assisted by professional designers. The judges will identify the entries only by numbers given the participants on receipt of their entry. Entries will NOT be returned

The contest closes February 28, 1975. Only entries postmarked earlier than this date will be considered.

Dear Editor:

This letter concerns my recent impeachment from the UPEI Student Council, and the background of events which culminated in that action. Please allow me to point out that my apparent indifference in attending Council meetings resulted not from my own apathy, but from apathy at higher levels, particularly in regard to Constitutional requirements of meeting notification.

As Article XXI, Section 5, states, "a copy of the agenda (of the Council meeting) shall be sent to all Council members and shall be posted around Campus twenty-four hours before the (Council) meeting". This requirement of agenda distribution, and consequent notification, has not been observed since last spring, and absenteeism was inevitable on the part of members who did not happen to intercept rumours of meetings. Indeed, it may be argued that the recent impeachments of Council members are invalid, since the meetings we missed were held in violation of the same article of the Constitution under which we were impeached.
