### Malt Liquors and Their Influence Upon Health.

While the use of many beverages having an alcoholic base have been condemned by hygienic journals, it must not be understood that all such beverages are under ban. The fact that malt liquors contain a percentage of alcohol does not militate against their use, and no unprejudiced health publication will hesitate to declare their wholesomeness, providing, of course, their purity has been ascertained beyond doubt. Ale, particularly, is a most desirable beverage, viewed from the standpoint of the hygienist, on account of its rich, nutritious qualities. It can be regarded as a liquid food, inasmuch as it furnishes a much larger proportion of the muscle-making and strength-producing elements than are ordinarily found even in the foods of pronounced nutritive value. It is for this reason that ale has the preference among malt beverages in the estimation of many who have studied the hygienic of food and drink. Of course, in order to derive the benefits which are to be secured by the use of ale, there must be a certainty that no adulterations are used in its production on account of the widespread use of other than the legitimate elements which enter into its composition. ### CAPE BRETON.

### Another Scheme for Development

The New York Tribune of the 11th inst announces that plans are being perfected for the construction of a short railway in Cape Breton Island, Nova Scotia, the completion of which it is said, will make possible a saving of 48 hours in the time required for bringing mail from Europe to this port. The line is to be built by the Cape Breton Railway Extension Co., Limited, which was incorporated under a special act of the Nova Scotia Legislature, passed March 30th, 1893, and was organized for business on September 8th. A number of New York capitalists are promoting it.

Louisburg, on the east coast of Cape Breton Island, 2,240 nautical miles from Liverpool, has an excellent harbor, never ice bound, with a pier having depth enough along side for admitting the largest vessels at low water. It is proposed by the company just organized to build a railway from this port, which may be made the western terminus of a line of fast mail from British steamships to Hawkesbury, on the Straits of Canso, a distance of 86 miles. From Hawkesbury existing railways would carry the intercolonial mails to all parts of the Dominion of Canada and the United States, the lines on this side of the border by which the mail would reach New York city being controlled by or in close relations with the Vanderbilt roads.

The new road is to be constructed and operated in two sections, the railway section and the bridge or ferry section over the Straits of Canso. The company has a capital of \$1,000,000, and is authorized to bond its line to the extent of \$15,000 a mile.

### Reciprocal Sympathy

LONDON, Oct. 4.—Mr. Henry Asquith, former Home Secretary, speaking at Newburgh this evening on the Transvaal situation, and referring to the attitude abroad said:—

The Americans have not forgotten, and I believe they will not forget, the attitude which this country, almost alone among the nations, assumed towards them recently, when they were enduring times of crisis and emergency similar to these, which seem before us. The sympathy, shown in those hours of danger and need engendered a warmth of gratitude, and, I might also say, tenderness of sentiment, which is no less genuine and strong between the nations than between individuals. Look back two years; there is nothing which we have more reason to congratulate ourselves upon, nothing that has added more to our international assets, than the fact that we established this tie of affectionate reciprocal sympathy with our great kindred nation beyond the Atlantic.
