

Police, Dogs Begin Patrol In Quebec

QUEBEC (CP)—Four members of the RCMP, each with a police dog began patrolling the Plains of Abraham as preparations were begun to put into effect security arrangements for Queen Elizabeth's visit.

The Queen and Prince Phillip are to arrive in Quebec City Saturday.

The RCMP said they took the dogs out in order to make them familiar with the areas where they will be stationed.

There will be seven public appearances of the royal couple and each time they will cross some area of the vast Plains of Abraham.

Many of the 300 RCMP members expected here have already arrived.

About 1,000 wooden barriers, linked by cables, have been set up along the routes as a means of holding back the spectators.

Consumer Price Index Declines

OTTAWA (CP)—Canada's consumer price index declined slightly during August, its mainstay to lower food prices. It was the second consecutive monthly drop.

At the start of September the index was 1.6-per-cent higher than a year earlier. In approximately the same period the index of industrial wages and salaries rose about 3.8 per cent.

The bureau of statistics on Tuesday placed the latest price index—based on 1949 prices—equaling 100—at 135.6 on about Sept. 1 compared with 136.1 a month earlier, 136.2 on July 1 and 135.4 on Sept. 1 last year.

The industrial wages index for the last week of July—latest figure available—stood at 201.9 against 201.6 a month earlier and 194.9 a year earlier. That index also is based on 1949 conditions equaling 100.

Latest drop in the price index was caused chiefly by a month-to-month drop of 1.8 per cent in the food index, which accounts for about one-quarter of all spending covered in the over-all price yardstick.

DBS said this decline reflected "further market seasonal price decreases for fresh fruits and vegetables." Lower prices also were reported for sugar, sirloin steak, ham, lamb and poultry. Prices were higher for eggs and most cuts of beef.

The food index was 122.7 on Sept. 1 compared with 123.1 a month earlier.

Most main indexes rose, except for the tobacco and alcohol component which was unchanged at 120.2.
