

THE DIGBY HORROR.—Dennis Hutchinson, who shot and killed Joseph Worthylake, and was himself shot and seriously injured at Marshalltown, Digby County, N. S., was examined before the magistrates on the 8th, and committed for trial. The examination was held at the house in which Hutchinson is being cared for, as it was dangerous to remove him to jail. The Digby Courier says:—"On Wednesday, matters took a more serious aspect, as the unfortunate man began complaining of pains about the shoulder-blade, and although it was at first thought that this might have been occasioned from the position in which he had been reclining, matters soon after took one of the most serious aspects. Thursday, Hutchinson complained of pains and stiffness about the jaws, which soon resulted in a lock of the same. Since Thursday noon he has been unable to swallow anything whatever, and our latest intelligence is to the effect that he is now lying in a most critical condition."

OATS WHOLE OR CRUSHED.—A series of experiments were recently conducted in Europe by Mr. Sanson to determine whether it was better to feed horses with oats whole or crushed. A graduated electrical apparatus was used to measure the muscular and nervous excitement caused by the feed, and the results led to the belief that oats eaten whole produces more exciting power per hour than crushed oats. The exciting principle in oats is a brown nitrogenous substance uncrystallizable, apparently belonging to the family of alkaloids, and which Mr. Sanson calls avenine. On many of our breeding farms it is the custom to bruise or crush oats fed to old mares and young colts. The stimulating effect of the food is more immediate than if the oats were fed whole, but is not so strong or durable. For race horses or work horses uncrushed oats is the better food.

REMEDY FOR SLEEPLESSNESS.—When ready for bed sit down in a easy position, relaxing all the muscles of the body, and let the head drop forward upon the breast, as low as it will without forcing it. Sit quietly in this way for a few minutes, letting all the will power off the body, and a restful, drowsy feeling will ensue, which will, if not disturbed, lead to refreshing sleep. If sleepless fits come on in the night one can simply sit up in the position described. Stiffness of any part of the body must be avoided, and it is well to bend the body forward after lying down, rather than keep it straight or thrown back upon the pillow.
