Committee on the Future of Fine Arts. The latter committee had two basic plans, one of which would lead to a major in Fine Arts, while the other plan was much more wide-ranging. In general, UPEI would work with Holland College and Confederation Centre by handling

the art history aspect, leaving the other institutions to take different components of a program. The first recommendation of the Academic Review and Planning Committee was that the faculty position be changed to a full-time position from a two-thirds one. No departmental status would be granted to Fine Arts. This was sent to the Budget Committee.

The second recommendation was that the faculty member examine the report of the committee on the Future of Fine Arts and from it recommend changes in the program. Senate would probably not see those changes until about two years from now.
