Anglicans Must Speak Minds On Church Union Principles

HAMILTON (CP) — Anglicans must feel free to speak their minds on the principles of union with the United Church of Canada, Rt. Rev. Walter E. Bagnall said here in his charge to the Synod of Niagara. But the Anglican bishop of Niagara emphasized that what was said must be said with love, patience and understanding. "It falls harshly upon Anglican ears to hear the former moderator of the United Church (Dr. J. R. Mutchmor of Toronto) refer to the episcopal system as an 'out-moded system' ridden ladder which should be reverently stored in some ecclesiastical museum."

"I suspect that what Dr. Mutchmor is really saying is that he has serious reservations about bishops."

St. FX Seen Model For Needy Aid

ANTIGONISH, N.S. (CP)—The United States could learn a great deal for its war-on-poverty programs from the social welfare movement founded by St. Francis Xavier University, the university's graduating class was told here.

Dr. Edward S. Skillin, editor of the U.S. Roman Catholic Journal Commonwealth, was the speaker on the first day of convocation exercises here.

He said the Antigonish movement, founded by the university in eastern Nova Scotia during the depression years, was offering "a constructive, distinctly different approach to the agonizing social question" of the depression while Roman Catholic spokesmen in the U.S. were vying in verbal battle with their Protestant and Jewish counterparts.

"How much we in the United States might learn today from the Antigonish experience is indicated by the controversy we are having about our urgent war-on-poverty programs."

Dr. Skillin received an honorary degree of doctor of letters, while John M. Hayes, Montreal insurance executive, received an honorary doctor of laws degree.

Some 161 science and education degrees were awarded Tuesday, with 136 diplomas presented in engineering, education and social leadership.

The top awards went to Norman Neil Walsh of Corner Brook, Nfld., a science student who received the highest aggregate in senior year, and Charles Gerard Macdonald of Amherst, who led the engineering class.
