Canadian-born financier Cyrus Eaton, one of the country's wealthiest men, celebrates his 60th birthday Friday. As his birthday approached, reporter George Barmann of the Cleveland Plain Dealer interviewed Eaton.

By GEORGE BARMANN, CLEVELAND (AP) — The lusty empire builder, one of the wealthiest men in North America, came up from his desk smiling and shook hands. He is the kind of man who approaches his guest; he does not wait for you.

He poured a glass of mineral water from a bottle for himself and straightened a single red rose in a vase. "Yes, it's very morning," Cyrus Eaton said, "I have one red rose."

When he was six, I could have him in the store for hours alone and he never failed my confidence. His qualifications for big business are brains and absolute trustworthiness.
