[SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.] The Liquor License Bill. OTTAWA, May 25. The Liquor License Bill was read a third time in the Senate on the 23rd. Senator Scott moved an amendment that it be referred to the Supreme Court to report upon it. This amendment was lost and the Bill passed. The Prerogation. The House of Commons was prorogued to-day. Seized for Improper Utterance. DUBLIN, May 25. The Kerry Sentinel was seized, yesterday, for heading an article "To Pall Mall," against the Queen. The Derby. LONDON, May 25. St. Blaze won the Derby on the 23rd, with Highland Chief second and Galliard third. The Mayo Murder Conspiracy. DUBLIN, May 25. The investigation into the murder conspiracy in May has been commenced. Marines Withdrawn. DUBLIN, May 24. The British Marines who have been assisting the Royal Irish Constabulary, have been withdrawn from Ireland. The Madagascar Difficulty. PARIS, May 25. The French troops landed at Madagascar yesterday. They occupy all the important military positions. England and the Vatican. LONDON, May 25. In the Imperial Parliament, on the 23rd, the Leader of the Government said the letter of Pope Leo XIII. was not written at the suggestion of the British Government; and that it was not the intention of the Government, at the present time, to establish diplomatic relations with the Vatican. Brooklyn Bridge Opened. NEW YORK, May 25. President Arthur, yesterday, formally opened the East River Bridge, between New York and Brooklyn. The demonstration on the occasion was a grand one. (Yesterday's Despatches.) The Retirement of the Governor General. OTTAWA, May 24. Sir John McDonald, in the House of Commons, yesterday, moved a complimentary address to the Governor-General, on the conclusion of his term of office, which is in October. It was seconded by Mr. Blake. Both Sir John and Mr. Blake referred in high terms to the conduct of the Marquis of Lorne and Princess Louise, during their residence in the Dominion. Bills Discharged. 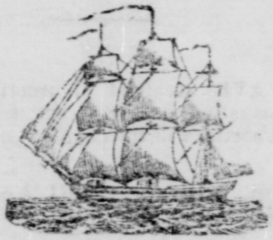
