A voucher for the seats was awarded to Miss Forrest in a competition held by London's new daily newspaper, the Recorder.

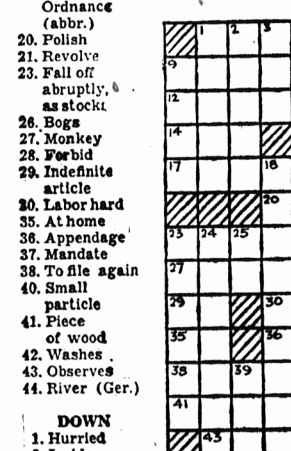
Entries came in from throughout the world after the newspaper's readers were invited to say in five words why they would like to fly to the moon.
