MISS DINGWELL'S BODY FOUND

On the Shore About a Mile From Morell Bridge.

The lifeless body of Miss Martha Dingwell, who disappeared so suddenly and mysteriously from Morell on the 2nd of April last, was found yesterday evening about six o'clock, on the north side of St. Peter's Bay, about one mile from Morell Bridge, where her hat, watch, etc., were found on the day following her disappearance.

The verdict of the coroner's jury is as follows: That the deceased, Martha Dingwell, came to her death by casting herself into the Morell River, at or near the Railway Bridge, and the jury can assign no cause whatever for the rash act.

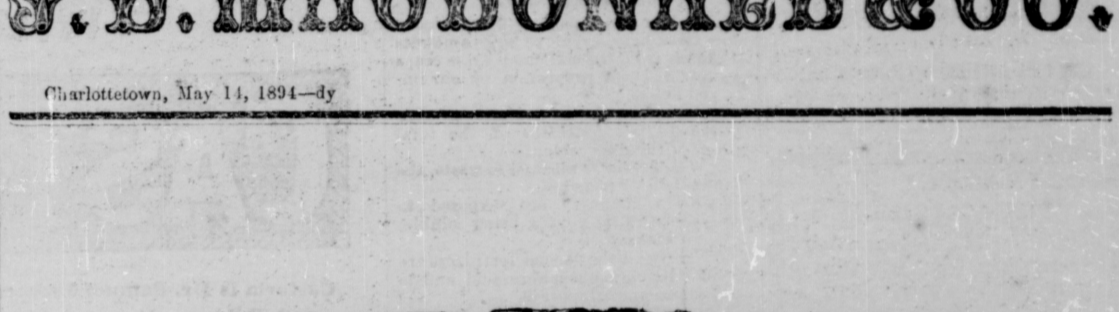
