News Notes.

The Petroleum Gas Co., of Gaspé, N. B., are pushing their operations with strong indications of success.

The Montreal steamer, over, and an Aquarian ship which arrived on Monday from Santos is here for the winter.

Mr. Oscar Dickson, of Gothenburg merchant, already famous as a generous patron of Arctic exploration, offers to defray the expenses of a new expedition to the north pole, if Dr. Nansen, who commanded the recent Greenland expedition, will accept the leadership. Dr. Nansen is willing to take command of a polar expedition, but as he is an officer of the Norwegian government, he desires that Norway will defray the expenses.

Even the great salmon harvests of the Pacific Coast would gradually wane if protective measures were not enforced. It is well that such measures should be taken without waiting till disastrous waste had proved the necessity for them.

Some of the statistics relating to tobacco consumption in the United States during the past fiscal year are suggestive, if not instructive. There were manufactured 280,000,000 more cigarettes than during the previous year.

The Government telegraphic line along the Gulf of St. Lawrence has now been completed to Point aux Esquimaux, 570 miles below Quebec, whence it is proposed to establish communication with Greenly Island in the Straits of Belle Isle, a further distance of 260 miles by submarine cables.

A writer in the New York Tribune recently called upon the American Government to put a duty on eggs in order to stop the "enriching of Canada at the expense of home producers."
