IN MEMORIAM

JOHN MACWILLIAM
The community of Augustine Cove, the friends and relatives of John MacWilliam were greatly shocked to learn of his sudden death Tuesday afternoon, May 1st. Jack, as he was familiarly known, was apparently enjoying good health and that morning was about his usual farm work. About midmorning he came to the house and said he wasn't feeling well. His wife becoming alarmed, immediately phoned a doctor, who, on arrival, decided to remove him to the hospital at once. But in spite of all that doctor's aid and nurses' care, death came in a very few hours.

Jack was the eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. George MacWilliam, and spent his entire life in the community where he was born on June 16th, 1885. He was one of Augustine Cove's most successful potato growers and farmers came from near and far to procure seed potatoes from him. Of a quiet retiring nature, and that morning was about his usual farm work. His spacious home was always open to visitors and his pleasing personality made him many friends.

The funeral service was held at the home on Thursday May 3rd and was very largely attended. Words of comfort were spoken by the pastor, Rev. J. H. Bishop, and the hymns "The Twentieth Psalm", "Abide with me", and "Forever with the Lord", were sung.

Interment was made in the beautiful Church of Scotland Cemetery, Cape Traverse. Besides his sorrowing widow, (formerly Mabel MacKay, Albany) he leaves to mourn his sudden passing four sons and two daughters, namely, Claude and Eldon at home, Frank, Cape Traverse, Bruce, Summerside, Helen, (Mrs. Melville Bell) Desable, and Winnie (Mrs. George Strong) Amherst, N. S.

Two sisters and two brothers also mourn the loss of a brother. Mrs. Willard Leard, Borden, Mrs. Elmer Francis, Boston, Gordon, C. p. e. Traverse, and Leaman, Augustine Cove.

Kidnapped French Soldiers Rescued In Desert Country

ALGIERS, Algeria (Reuters)—Helicopter-borne French troops landed on the sun-scorched sands of the northern Sahara Monday and rescued 50 to 62 kidnapped soldiers.

The soldiers, all native Algerians, had been captured Sunday when rebel forces seized an isolated French post.

A French officer in charge of native affairs and his pretty young wife were slain in the rebel assault.

French forces, lifted by helicopter to the desert country, located all but 12 of the captured Moslem soldiers and gave chase to the rebels who left the prisoners behind and fled across the sands.

The desert incident occurred as French military authorities claimed a near-recent toll of 240 slain insurgents during fighting Saturday and Sunday in the Kabylie, Oranie and Constantine areas.

An 18-year-old French schoolgirl and officials Monday about her eight days of captivity in a rebel hideout near a bus ambush in a mountain pass near Nemours.

The girl, Micheline Gomez, limped into an outpost Sunday with bleeding feet and torn clothing after being freed by her captors.

"The rebels did not maltreat me," she said, "but I was so frightened."

Reports from Timoud near the south Moroccan border said rebel bands have encircled dug-in French foreign legionnaires. Outpost Timoud, an important desert outpost serving as a land and air link between southwest Algeria and French West Africa.
