to control their hunting dogs will have to learn the hard way.

Every where I go I hear farmers talking about the number of foxes on the prowl. This week a farmer sportsman told me that there were five litters of foxes, that he knew of, raised and had left their dens within a mile of his premises. He saw one female with a litter of six sleek red pups taking off from a den under an old stack on his next neighbor's property. This farm hasn't been cropped for three years and last year the hay wasn't even cut. He told me the pups were rolling fat and they must have been fed almost entirely on field mice as there wasn't a sign of a feather or rabbit fur or bones near the den. I checked this den and he was right about the signs. Of the five three were under old stacks, one under a vacant barn and the other was a regular ground den. There are large lit-

ters of foxes this year and this means that food is abundant. Another farmer living some miles distant told me he watched a mother fox trotting across his back field with seven nice litters of pups following her. When five litters are raised to the point where they are able to forage for themselves on a block of land approximately 800 acres in extent it's time to sit up and do some tall figuring and thinking. This farmer was correct about the dens - I checked them.

While the red fox is an opportunist, and takes what comes in the way of eats whether it be rabbit, duck, Hun, pheasant or Ruffed grouse, he is above all else a mouse hunter. A fox uses his head for more than a rack to hold his ears. He or she reasons thusly: "We have a family of six or seven children to feed so why waste time looking for food supplied with wings when we can have mice for the picking up and carrying to the den. The proof of the pudding is in the eating and if foxes were as detrimental to game birds as some persons contend how is it that our pheasant population has reached the peak it don't get me wrong in this. Our present fox population is out of all proportion to the general scheme of things and should be whittled down. Their depredations among domestic poultry has reached an all time high. Hens and chickens, turkeys and what have you are like mice - to be had for the picking up and their bones serve as something for the pups to amuse themselves with and sharpen their teeth on.

When it comes to egg eaters and nest robbers the crow, skunk and raccoon have the fox backed off the map. This season the skunk appears to have faded from the picture, temporarily at least, but the coons are making up the ground the skunk has lost. At present the raccoon is bearing the brunt of the farmer's ire.

Tales are legion, particularly in southern and eastern Kings county, respecting the Raccoons' raids on domestic poultry, hens, chickens, turkeys and ducks. Nothing seems to daunt them. They'll climb to the eave of a barn and squirm in through the hole left for the hay pulley to get at chickens if all other means are closed to them. A coon has been seen climbing up a wire pen and turning the button that holds the door shut. Yes, they can open doors and most anything else. A coon hasn't been rated by scientists as having one of the highest I. Q.'s among the animal kingdom for nothing. Here is a case in point: Last fall a farmer in the St. Catherine's district of Kings county lost all, but three or four of his ducks one night from a raccoon. To give himself time to build a proper shelter for them he placed the remaining birds in a box, placed the box in the porch of his dwelling house, and fastened the door securely. In the morning the ducks were dead. The coon had entered the cellar through the hatch, managed in some manner to open the trapdoor in the porch floor, and had then proceeded to gnaw and tear his way into the box and kill the ducks. If that isn't using one's thinking cap - what is?
