Good Farming Operation Means Keeping Records

Investment in farming is increasing and farming is becoming more productive as a result of technological advances (new sprays, improved varieties, new machinery, etc.). But improvement in productivity cannot be expected to increase from technology alone. It is important to supplement this technology. Management must have records and data on past performance on which to base decision for future production. In the course of a year's operation a farm operator handles a great deal of money. Capital is a very important item and proper management of a farmer's financial affairs is just as vital to the successful operation of the farm as his crop and livestock management ability. All the detailed facts relating to the business cannot be committed to memory. Consequently, some organized system of recording these facts is necessary. This organized system of recording facts is called a farm account book. The purpose of farm accounts can be listed as follows: 1) To determine the annual financial returns and costs from the farm. 2) To compare one year's farm business with another. 3) To provide the figures required for income tax returns. 4) To provide information required to improve the farm operation. 5) To aid in obtaining credit. ACCOUNT BOOKS AVAILABLE There are many sources of farm account books. Banks and machinery companies have books available as well as the Department of Agriculture. These books suitable for most mixed farming operations. The farm account book available from the Department of Agriculture provides for a detailed breakdown of receipts and expense, complete inventory, credit transactions, summary page and many other sections. Certainly a wealth of information can be kept in such a book. Any of these books are suitable for most mixed farming operations. However, if one finds that they are not suitable for his farm or if records are required for a specialized operation, a columnar ledger could be purchased. Using a prepared account book as a guide, the columns could be titled in accordance with the information you desire for your own specific business.
