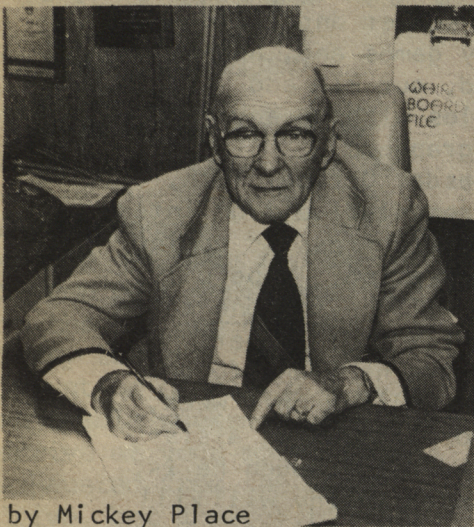


# David & Goliath

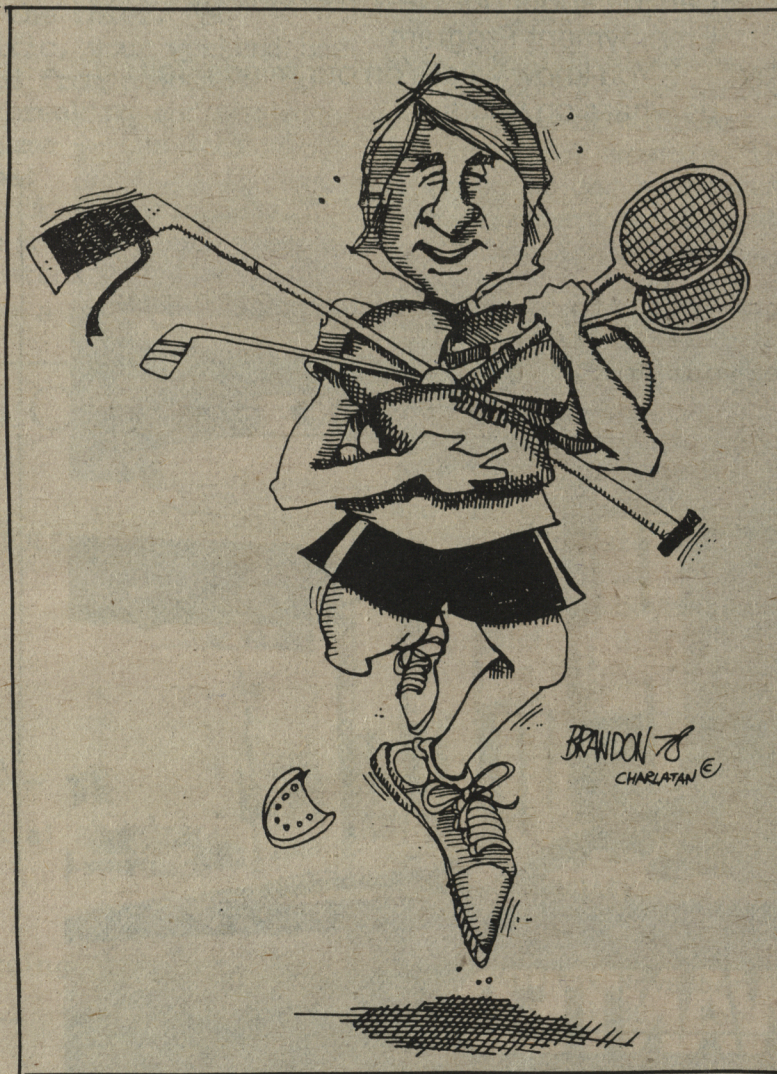
